A malware incident at cybersecurity vendor Barracuda in which it advised clients to physically replace security hardware to counter the threat could weaken insurers' arguments about cyberattacks not being able to...

...a situation like Barracuda's is distinguishable from EMOI because the Barracuda situation involves the actual functioning of a physical device, as opposed to the integrity of software or data independent of the functionality of the physical device in EMOI, said **Avery Dial**, a partner with Kaufman Dolowich & Voluck LLP.

...the court's final analysis held that the damage to the software is only covered if the physical media that contains it is physically damaged, **Dial** said. ..."If you've got damage to information on a hard drive, and the hard drive's not damaged, it's really the information you care about. Because theoretically, you could just wipe that hard drive and use it again," **Dial** said. "But here, you've got a device that you can't use anymore for its intended purpose of being an email gateway."
